Processional

Note:

Children are welcome to stay with their parents for the duration of the service if so desired. Beginning with the readings and ending at announcements, children 0-3, may be taken to a staffed nursery through the doors on the left of the worship space.

At the same time, children 4-9 are invited back to the children's ministry room for a time of teaching and response at an age-appropriate level.

Here we "acclaim" the purpose for which we gather, which is to be with God and one another, and be sent into the world as his people.

The Collect of the Day

Leader Almighty God, you have knit together your elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical Body of your Son: Give us grace so to follow your blessed saints in all virtuous and godly living, that we may come to those ineffable joys that you have prepared for those who truly love you; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who with you and the Holy Spirit lives and reigns, one God, in glory everlasting.

The Collect of the Day "collects" the theme of the particular day in the church's calendar into one prayer.

The Exhortation

Leader Dearly beloved, Scripture teaches that we were all dead in our sins and trespasses, but by grace we may be saved through faith. Our Savior Jesus Christ said, "Unless one is born of water and the Spirit, he cannot enter the kingdom of God"; and he commissioned the Church to "make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the Name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit." Here we ask our heavenly Father that these Candidates, being baptized with water, may be filled with the Holy Spirit, born again, and received into the Church as living members of Christ's body. Therefore, I urge you to call upon God the Father, through our Lord Jesus Christ, that of his abundant mercy he will grant to these Candidates that which by nature they cannot have.

Presenters I present _____ to receive the Sacrament of Baptism.

Leader Today, on behalf of this child, you shall make vows to renounce the devil and all his works, to trust God wholeheartedly, and to serve him faithfully. It is your task to see that this child is taught, as soon as he is able to learn, the meaning of all these vows, and of the Faith that you will profess as revealed in the Holy Scriptures. He/she must come to put his faith in Jesus Christ, and learn the Creeds, the Lord’s Prayer, the Ten Commandments, and all other things that a Christian ought to know, believe, and do for the welfare of his/her soul. When he/she has embraced all these, he/she is to come to the Bishop to be confirmed, that he may publicly claim the Faith for his own and be further strengthened by the Holy Spirit to serve Christ and his kingdom.

Are you willing and ready to undertake this?

Presenters I renounce them.

Leader Almighty God deliver you from the powers of darkness and evil, and lead you into the light and obedience of the kingdom of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord.

Leader Do you turn to Jesus Christ and confess him as your Lord and Savior?

Presenters I do.

Leader Do you joyfully receive the Christian Faith, as revealed in the Holy Scriptures of the Old and New Testaments?

Presenters I do.

Congregation stands.

Question Will you who witness these vows do all in your power to support these persons in their life in Christ?

Answer **We will!**

He descended to the dead.

On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven,

and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

Leader That they may persevere in resisting evil, and, whenever they fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord.

All **We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

Leader That they may proclaim by word and deed the Good News of God in Christ Jesus to a lost and broken world.

All **We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

Leader That as living members of the Body of Christ, they may grow up in every way into him who is the head.

All **We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

Leader That, looking to Jesus, they may run with endurance the race set before them, and at the last receive the unfading crown of glory.

All **We beseech you to hear us, Good Lord.**

Leader Let us pray.

Almighty and everlasting Father, in your great mercy you saved Noah and his family in the Ark from the destruction of the flood, prefiguring the Sacrament of Holy Baptism. Look mercifully upon these your servants. Wash and sanctify them through your Holy Spirit, that they may be delivered from destruction and received into the Ark of Christ's Church; and being steadfast in faith, joyful through hope, and rooted in love, they may pass through the turbulent floods of this troublesome world and come into the land of everlasting life, through Jesus Christ our Lord.

The Baptism

Leader Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, received them as your own children by adoption, made them members of your holy Church, and raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit, that they may enjoy everlasting salvation through Jesus Christ our Lord.

Leader Let us welcome the newly baptized!

All **We receive you into the fellowship of the Church. Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in the royal priesthood of all his people!**

Collect for Children

All **Almighty God, heavenly Father, you have blessed us with the joy and care of children: give us calm strength and patient wisdom as we bring them up, that they may love all that is true, and pure, and lovely, following the example of their Savior Jesus Christ. Amen.**

Children are invited to the nursery (age 0-3) or the kids room (age 4-9). Children 0-3 must be escorted by their parents; 4-9 will be met at the side door by their teacher, and walked back to their room. All kids will be welcomed back to the adults after the Peace.

The First Lesson

Please be seated.

Revelation 7:9-17

9 After this I looked, and there before me was a great multitude that no one could count, from every nation, tribe, people and language, standing before the throne and before the Lamb. They were wearing white robes and were holding palm branches in their hands. 10 And they cried out in a loud voice: "Salvation belongs to our God, who sits on the throne, and to the Lamb." 11 All the angels were standing around the throne and around the elders and the four living creatures. They fell down on their faces before the throne and worshiped God, 12 saying: "Amen! Praise and glory and wisdom and thanks and honor and power and strength be to our God for ever and ever. Amen!" 13 Then one of the elders asked me, "These in

white robes—who are they, and where did they come from?” 14 I answered, “Sir, you know.” And he said, “These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. 15 Therefore, they are before the throne of God and serve him day and night in his temple; and he who sits on the throne will shelter them with his presence. 16 ‘Never again will they hunger; never again will they thirst. The sun will not beat down on them,’ nor any scorching heat. 17 For the Lamb at the center of the throne will be their shepherd; ‘he will lead them to springs of living water.’ ‘And God will wipe away every tear from their eyes.’”

The Psalm

Psalm 149

1 Praise the Lord. Sing to the Lord a new song, his praise in the assembly of his faithful people.

2 Let Israel rejoice in their Maker; let the people of Zion be glad in their King.

3 Let them praise his name with dancing and make music to him with timbrel and harp.

4 For the Lord takes delight in his people; he crowns the humble with victory.

5 Let his faithful people rejoice in this honor and sing for joy on their beds.

6 May the praise of God be in their mouths and a double-edged sword in their hands,

7 to inflict vengeance on the nations and punishment on the peoples,

8 to bind their kings with fetters, their nobles with shackles of iron,

9 to carry out the sentence written against them— this is the glory of all his faithful people. Praise the Lord.

The Psalms are the prayer book of the People of God throughout all ages. We read and pray a psalm together each week responsively to learn to pray as God's People.

The Second Lesson

Ephesians 1:15-23

15 For this reason, ever since I heard about your faith in the Lord Jesus and your love for all God's people, 16 I have not stopped giving thanks for you, remembering you in my prayers. 17 I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better. 18 I pray that the eyes of your heart may be enlightened in order that you may know the hope to which he has called you, the riches of his glorious inheritance in his holy people, 19 and his incomparably great power for us who believe. That power is the same as the mighty strength 20 he exerted when he raised Christ from the dead and seated him at his right hand in the heavenly realms, 21 far above all rule and authority, power and dominion, and every name that is invoked, not only in the present age but also in the one to come. 22 And God placed all things under his feet and appointed him to be head over everything for the church, 23 which is his body, the fullness of him who fills everything in every way.

wine we may come to
share in the divine life of
Him who humbled Himself

your Son Jesus Christ our
Lord.

Over the whole Eucharist:
With a humble spirit and a
contrite heart, may we be
accepted by you, O Lord,,
and may our sacrifice in

The Sanctus

All	Holy, Holy, Holy, Lord God of power and might, heaven and earth are full of your glory. Hosanna in the highest! Blessed is he who comes in the name of the Lord. Hosanna in the highest!
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This "ascent" is represented in our singing of "The Sanctus" (meaning "holy"). These are the words of praise we see given to God in heaven, recounted in Isaiah 6 and Revelation 4.

The Prayer of Consecration

Leader Holy and Gracious Father...Therefore we proclaim the
mystery of faith:
People **Christ has died!**
Christ is risen!
Christ will come again!
Leader ... All this we ask through your Son Jesus Christ: By him, and
with him, and in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor
and glory is your, Almighty Father, now and for ever.
People **Amen!**

Here the priest recounts the saving acts of Jesus for the life of the world. He also consecrates the common elements of bread and wine for the holy purpose of communion with Jesus himself.

The Lord's Prayer

All **Our Father, who art in heaven,
hallowed be thy name.
Thy Kingdom come,
thy will be done,
on earth as it is in heaven.
Give us this day our daily bread,
And forgive us our trespasses,
as we forgive those who trespass against us.

After the Lord's Prayer
you are invited to pray along with the Celebrant as they pray silently:

First:
Deliver us, Lord, from every evil. Graciously grant us peace in our days that by the help of your mercy we may be always free from sin, and safe from all distress, as we await the hope and coming of our Savior, Jesus Christ.

Second:
May this comixture and the consecration of the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ bring eternal life to those who receive it. Amen.

Third:
Lord Jesus Christ, you said to your apostles: "Peace I give you to, my own peace I leave with you." Regard not our sins, but the faith of your Church, and give us the peace and unity of that Heavenly City, where with the Father and the Holy Spirit you live and reign, now and forever. Amen.

The Prayer of Humble Access

Grant us, therefore, gracious Lord, so to eat the flesh of your dear Son Jesus Christ, and to drink his blood, that our sinful bodies may be made clean by his body, and our souls washed through his most precious blood, and that we may evermore dwell in him, and he in us. Amen.

The Agnus Dei

**All Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world
Lamb of God, you take away the sin of the world
Grant us your peace!**

The Invitation

Leader Behold the Lamb of God, behold him who takes away the sins of the world. Blessed are those who are invited to the marriage supper of the Lamb!

All Lord we are not worthy that you should enter under our roof, but only say the word and we shall be healed!

All baptized Christians are invited to come forward to receive Holy Communion.

It has long been the teaching of the Church that to receive only consecrated bread or wine is to receive the sacrament in full. If you have a need to refrain from either element, know you are fully in communion with Christ and his Church.

Gluten-free communion bread is available upon request.

The Communion

The moments before and after you receive Holy Communion are especially good times to pray. One traditional prayer we recommend is the "Anima Christi":

***Soul of Christ, sanctify me;
Body of Christ, save me;
Blood of Christ, inebriate me;
Water from the side of Christ, wash me;
Passion of Christ, strengthen me;
O Good Jesus, hear me!
Within thy wound, hide me;
Suffer me not to be separated from thee;
From the malicious enemy defend me!
In the hour of my death call me, and bid me come unto thee,
That with thy Saints I may be with thee for ever and ever!
Amen.***

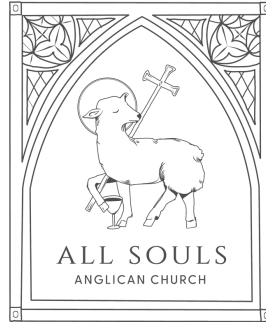
